This 2021 VITALity Annual Report recounts our 6th year in service to the people of South Jersey. Throughout these six years we have continued to provide care, advocacy, and support through the charitable programs described in this Annual Report. Our services and programs are designed to assist those elderly who struggle with declining health and those with disabilities who face multiple life challenges each day.

In this 2021 Annual Report you will read about our programs and see how our services have impacted a growing number of people here in South Jersey as we continue to live through and endure the tragic effects of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. Each program and service is unique in its aim and structure, yet each is delivered with the same sense of caring and compassion, knowing that our response to others' needs fulfills the commands of Jesus to love and care for one another.

VITALity services remain just a phone call away. Our Resource and Referral Help Line (888-26-VITALity, or 888-268-4825) is designed to answer your call for healthcare related assistance of any kind. Our nurses and social workers respond quickly to work with you in easing the burden of navigating the complexities of the healthcare system to secure the services and the resources you need to manage your care and preserve your dignity through the aging process. Our internal quality studies show a 95% response rate for contact

by a professional staff member within 24 hours of each call received for assistance. What a comfort that can be in those times of anxiety when faced with difficult decisions and seemingly endless barriers to the care you need.

VITALity is supported through the generosity of donors to the Camden Diocese's House of Charity - Bishop's Annual Appeal and through grants from the Healthcare Foundation of the Diocese of Camden. Our services are always provided free of charge to anyone in need, regardless of their faith, beliefs, or religious affiliation. It is through your prayers and generosity that we are able to continue being the healing presence of Christ to the growing number of people we serve in His name.

Care Coordination, Resource and Referral Help Line

...to assist those in need

VITALity's Registered Nurses and Social Workers (MSWs) encounter individuals and family members during some of the most difficult times of their lives, giving them hope, support and encouragement.

Our Resource and Referral Help Line (1-888-268-4825) received 1,141 inquiries from individuals seeking information, resources and guidance through their journey of aging and declining health (11% increase over the prior year.) VITALity's Registered Nurses and Social Workers reached out to them promptly to arrange a phone consultation or home visit, resulting in 4,424 encounters representing a 51% increase over 2020.

VITALity's Care Coordinators arranged 2,232 essential services and also provided greatly needed education, advocacy and support to some of the most vulnerable populations of seniors and persons with disabilities.

Since December 2015 when VITALity's doors opened, 5,482 individual requests for assistance have been met by our Care Coordination professionals.

225 individuals contacted VITALity for assistance in navigating the difficult online COVID vaccination scheduling systems and successfully obtained appointments to get their shot.

Parish Nursing continues its strong presence in the Diocese of Camden. Even with the challenges of the last two years, the dedicated healthcare professionals in this ministry adapted, fostering growth and expansion. Three parishes established new ministries, bringing the total number of parish nurse ministries to 34 and five nurses completed the Foundations of Faith Community Nursing course.

Ministry members found unique ways to safely achieve their goal of whole person healing, continuing to touch the lives of countless parishioners. Outreach included phone calls to parishioners, running errands, dropping off necessary medications, virtual prayer groups, social distance walking in the park, hosting flu shot clinics, and collaborations with other parish-based ministries.

Weekly bulletin blurbs were created in some parishes, offering health tips and education. Parish nurses hosted live sessions on social media platforms allowing parishioners to engage safely and ask health related

questions of nurses and other qualified healthcare professionals. Videos were produced to help parishioners learn best evidence-based practice techniques to take their blood pressure at home. CPR classes were offered, teaching community members essential life-saving skills.

Outreach by parish nurses helped keep parishioners engaged and connected. With the commitment of these dedicated professionals, Parish Nursing will continue to grow in the coming year and is blessed to have support from VITALity Catholic Healthcare Services.



JOURNEY OF HOPE | MERCY TEAMS

Over the past year, VITALity continued to support parish-based ministries whose focus was centered on some of our most vulnerable populations in the Diocese.

Our Journey of Hope ministries, currently in eight parishes, assisted those going through their battle with cancer. Volunteers dropped off meals, helped with light household chores, provided transportation to and from treatments, and offered prayers and companionship. While small in gesture, these acts of kindness, service, and love assured individuals that they are not alone during their difficult journey.

Our 11 parish Mercy Team ministries serve a similar purpose, assisting older adults and those who are disabled to live and stay independent in their own homes. As the pandemic placed limits on this ministry, volunteers found creative ways to lend support by picking up and dropping off food or prescriptions, or making a call of encouragement. Mercy Team members often collaborate with VITALity's Care Coordinators to help identify people in need of greater assistance.

Serving the needs of our most vulnerable community members continues to be paramount, remembering that each act is a work of mercy and compassion that reflects God's love.



The Hospital Chaplaincy program cares for the sick, hospitalized, and elderly infirm in 18 institutions throughout South Jersey. This past year our chaplaincy teams continued ministering in the challenging situation of life during the COVID-19 pandemic, finding new ways to bring Sacramental Ministry as well as prayer, comfort, assistance, and solidarity to the sick. Amidst these challenges and with adequate personal protective equipment, our team visited the sick and gave Holy Communion to an average of over 1,300 patients and staff each month. Our Priest Chaplains were able to administer the Sacrament of the Sick to over 3,700 persons in need. These statistics show the ongoing commitment of our chaplains and volunteers to our sick and suffering brothers and sisters.

Through VITALity Catholic Healthcare Services our pastoral care teams minister in all of the counties in our Diocese. Each team consists of a

Priest Chaplain along with an Associate Chaplain (Deacon, Religious Sister, or Lay Minister.) Our priests provide the Sacraments of Anointing and Penance, while all provide Eucharist, pastoral care, prayer, religious articles, and compassionate presence to the infirm and aging who are in need. Assisted by other parish-based ministries, those who were sick have been able to receive phone calls, prayer bags, hand-knitted blankets, greeting cards, rosaries, scapulars, and Christmas cards during their time of sickness. Additionally, our chaplains ministered to the dedicated healthcare professionals who have given themselves tirelessly to serve in these times of global pandemic.

Ministry With the Deaf and Persons With Disabilities serves people who have communication, developmental, behavioral, and other physical limitations by ensuring their well-being through advocacy and actions of concrete steps, to safeguard their full integration and participation in the life of the Church. Through adapted and accommodative programs of catechesis and sacramental preparation, along with the support and promotion of the expansion of Masses of Inclusion throughout the Diocese, this ministry works to ensure that persons with disabilities experience belonging in the parish, Diocese, and Church at large.

Throughout the year, opportunities for social engagement and gathering

continued, lightening the burden of dependency and allowing the person to emerge and grow as a social being, renewing the joy and happiness that human fellowship brings.

PARISH SENIOR SOCIAL DAY CENTERS

The Parish-based Senior Social Day Ministries engaged our older adult communities, keeping them connected by gathering in fellowship and love. As pandemic protocols shifted gatherings outdoors, ministry directors answered the call by designing outdoor programming that ensured members could still socialize safely. Once activities moved back inside, The Golden Slippers of St. Simon Stock Parish celebrated the opening of their new meeting space, *The Bishop Dennis J. Sullivan Parish Center*.



The Diocese's three senior day centers provided spiritual enrichment, exercise programs, intergenerational activities, holiday celebrations, and health and lifestyle presentations. As part of World Day of Prayer for Grandparents and the Elderly, VITALity staff led prayer services at each center, honoring grandparents and older adults as role models of faith in our communities.

Our senior social day centers, supported by VITALity, remain dedicated to our senior members, working to help keep them safe, independent, healthy and engaged so they can live "Life to the Fullest!"

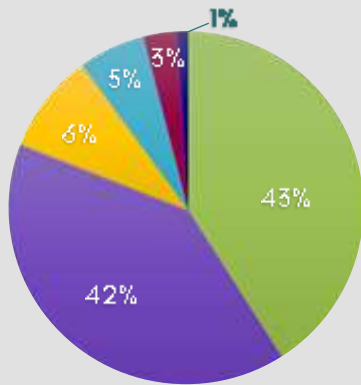


LIFE TO THE FULLEST MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM

Members can request free literature on a variety of topics including spiritual enrichment and healthy living. VITALity's staff navigated our members through these unprecedented times, helping them acquire their vaccine shots by scheduling appointments and finding locations where the vaccines were available. These services were a lifeline to our members.
