
Mission Statement

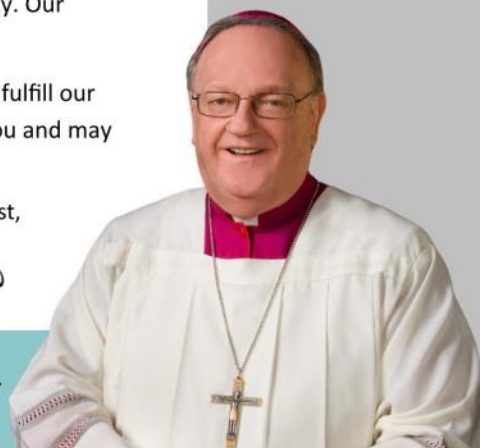

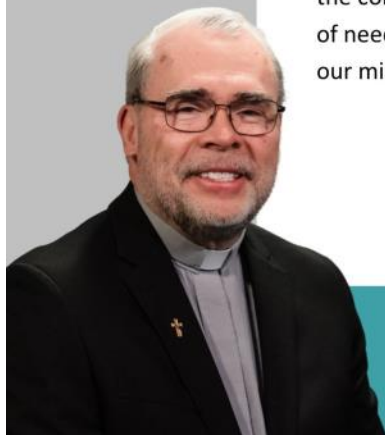

Care Coordination

Navigating the complexities of the many healthcare services can be confusing and overwhelming, especially for individuals with family members experiencing the challenges of aging and caregiving. VITALity's nurses (RNs) and social workers (MSWs) are here to assist seniors and persons with disabilities when they need us the most, providing education, advocacy, resources and support in accessing essential programs and services that promote health, safety and well-being at home or another setting.



One call to VITALity's Resource and Referral Help Line (1-888-268-4825) offers individuals and family members valuable information about resources and connects them to knowledgeable care coordinators for more comprehensive assistance. In 2023, VITALity's Care Coordinators responded to 1,011 Help Line inquiries, resulting in 3,888 personalized and confidential phone consultations and home visits. Since the inception of VITALity's Care Coordination Program, 7,548 individuals have been served and 22,087 home visits and phone consultations completed.

Stephen Ministry



19 STEPHEN MINISTRY PARISHES throughout the Diocese of Camden

Providing an additional avenue of pastoral and spiritual care, Stephen Ministry is a lay ministry based on the idea that all Christians are called to minister to others, offering compassionate and caring listening and accompaniment to people going through life struggles. With over 250 trained Stephen Ministers in 19 parishes throughout the Diocese, all pledge to remain steadfast in their mission to walk with others through listening, prayer and offering emotional and spiritual support, providing one-on-one confidential Christian care to members of our parishes and our communities.

Ministry with the Deaf & Persons with Disabilities

VITALity's Ministry with the Deaf and Persons with Disabilities invites all person with disabilities and their families to experience, throughout their lifespan, their essential belonging in their parish, the Diocese, and the Church at large. We work with clergy and families as well as other community partners to encourage people to participate fully in their parishes and communities. With 5 parishes offering Masses of Welcome and Inclusion, sensory friendly liturgies, faith-based programming, and voice interpreted Masses, this ministry continues to grow and serve more people each year.



Hospital Chaplaincy

VITALity's Hospital Chaplaincy program cares for the hospitalized and elderly infirm in 18 institutions throughout South Jersey by providing compassionate emotional and spiritual support to Catholic patients and their families. Our team visited the sick and gave Holy Communion to an average of nearly 5,700 patients, families and staff each month. Our Priest Chaplains administered the Sacrament of the Sick to 3,800 persons desiring this grace of the Lord's healing mercy. These statistics show the ongoing commitment of our chaplains who remain present to those in need of pastoral care.

Through VITALity Catholic Healthcare Services, our pastoral care teams minister in all of the secular hospitals within our Diocese. Each team consists of a Priest Chaplain along with an Associate Chaplain (Deacon, Religious Sister, or Lay Minister). Additionally, our chaplains minister to the spiritual needs of the dedicated healthcare professionals who care for the sick within all of these institutions.

Parish Nursing



34 Parish Nurse ministries throughout the Diocese touched the lives of over 18,000 parishioners in 2023. Working to educate and bring resources to their parish communities, they coordinated flu shots clinics, health fairs, blood drives and blood pressure clinics. Recognizing the need for education in the community, they organized health presentations on pertinent topics such as cancer screenings, stroke and mental health. Parish nurses organized exercise programs such as walking with seniors in the park helping to emphasize the important benefits of staying active. Recognizing the impact of grief and loss many parish nurse ministries organized Healing Masses at their individual parishes.

The annual parish nurse Foundations of Faith Community nursing course and parish nurse retreat continued in 2023 with 5 new parish nurses being commissioned in the Diocese of Camden in September and over 20 nurses attending the parish nurse retreat in May.

Mercy Teams & Cancer Care Ministries

Mercy Teams and Cancer Care Ministries are parish-based ministries with similar mission to be the working hands of Jesus Christ helping those in the parish community during times of need. Trained volunteers provide practical support to help their parish community members. Cancer Care ministry members provide comfort, support and aid to those journeying through cancer treatments. Helping with rides to treatment, bringing meals before or after chemo or helping with laundry are examples of how ministry members aim to reduce workload during a difficult time. Mercy Team volunteers work similarly as a helpful presence to older adults and those with disabilities, helping to assist them with tasks such as rides to Mass, doctor's appointments, picking up prescriptions, providing meals or simply providing companionship.

Parish-Based Senior Ministries

In 2023, Parish Senior Social Day Centers thrived with engaging, fun-filled programs for senior members. Special celebrations, exercise classes, dancing and enrichment activities provided positive social experiences for seniors in our community. The dedicated Senior Social Day Center directors, staff and volunteers offered welcoming environments to a growing number of senior members to forge new friendships, laugh, and



grow in fellowship with one another. VITALity Catholic Healthcare Services hosted two joy-filled gatherings for our senior members. In 2023 we honored Centenarians and Nonagenarians in the Camden Diocese with a special Mass and reception to acknowledge this blessed group of individuals (ranging in age from 90 - 102) and the gifts they uniquely bring to the world. On October 31, we collaborated with Prime Timers Senior Social Day Center, Incarnation Parish, to celebrate a new season together with a Fall Fling. Approximately 100 senior members from several parishes in the Camden Diocese dressed in Halloween costumes, line danced, socialized and enjoyed a delicious meal together.

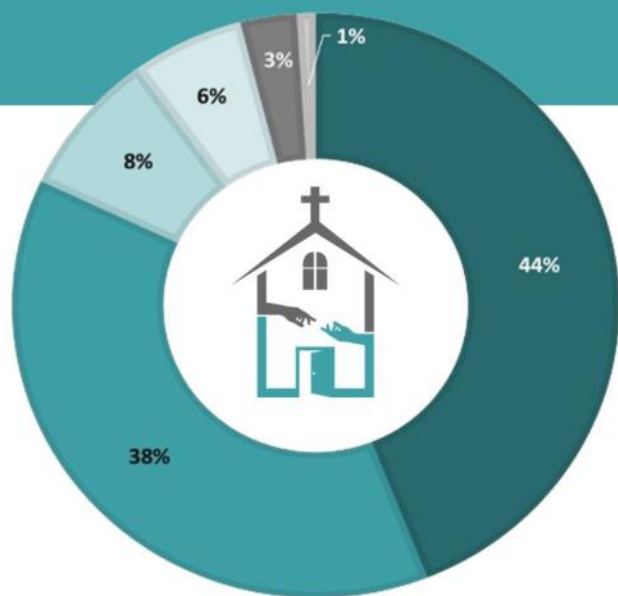

Members receive a quarterly electronic newsletter that includes important health updates and resources, Diocesan events and more. Members are given free health and wellness information on a variety of topics to support a healthy body, mind and spirit.
